Atlanta resident and Australia native Mark Wuttke left his position as president of Jurlique Holistic Skin Care Inc., the U.S. arm of an Australia-based all-natural skin care company, to start his own spa consulting firm earlier this year.

Mr. Wuttke began the Wuttke Group LLC to consult four and five star hotels and resorts on opening or improving spas and wellness facilities on their properties.

An employee of Jurlique since 1998, Mr. Wuttke moved to the U.S. in 2001 to head-up the company's headquarters, which were then based in Atlanta.

While president of Jurlique, Mr. Wuttke opened 15 Jurlique spas in the U.S., including locations in Beverly Hills, Calif., New York and San Francisco, as well as one in the InterContinental Hotel in Buckhead.

He is currently working with Orlando, Fla.-based Niki Bryan Inc., which owns and operates Walt Disney World's Grand Floridian Hotel spa that welcomes more than 100,000 spa-goers annually.
